Some Things to Remember

- Begin studies with a 500 level course (usually CRS559).
- The Creative Problem Solving strand of courses must be taken in the following sequence: CRS559, CRS610, CRS670, and CRS680 (note that CRS 680 is an elective).
- A minimum of 15 credit hours of your master's courses must be at or above the 600 level. (33 cr. hr. program)
- CRS635 should be the final formal course (i.e., required course) in the program and 690/795 should be taken near the end of the program
- A thesis is 6 credit hours (registering 3 credits at a time). If you chose a thesis, we strongly suggest taking a research course as one of your electives.
- If you wish to complete all of the formal courses in approximately one calendar year, you must begin your studies in the summer.
- If you are employed full-time, we recommend no more than two courses per semester.

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
